JANUARY 28: Sean Hogan*

5:30-7:30pm

Author of *Trees for all Seasons: Broadleaved Evergreens for Temperate Climates* and an expert horticulturist, Sean has extensive knowledge of plants with Asian and Japanese origins, the topic he will address in his January lecture at the Garden. Using more than 80 live plant samples, Sean introduces some of his nursery's finest achievements.

MARCH 18: Ron Herman*

In Search of an Unknown Garden

Landscape architect and author Ron Herman talks about his remarkable career in garden design and the influence of Japan on his work. Author of the highly regarded *A Guide to the Gardens of Kyoto*, Ron spent several years studying in Japan and has designed many of North America's largest and most intricate private gardens. APRIL 1: Talon Buchholz

The Wonderful World of Japanese Maples

Owner and president of Buchholz & Buchholz Nursery and the Flora Wonder™ Arboretum, Talon is a wholesale grower of Japanese maples, dwarf and unusual conifers, and other choice ornamental trees and shrubs. He speaks about his long experience with developing new varieties of Japanese maples—how they are selected, trialed, and introduced.

JULY 22: Hoichi Kurisu

The Japanese Garden in the 21st Century—An Evolving Art

Former landscape director of the Portland Japanese Garden, Hoichi Kurisu is one of the most respected Japanese garden designers in the world. Hoichi was a principal designer of the Morikami Gardens in Florida, the Anderson Japanese Garden in Illinois, and the roof garden on the Contemporaine in Chicago—among many others. Over the last 20 years, his practice has focused on the creation of what we know today as "restorative or healing gardens."

OCTOBER 21: Botond Bogнар*

5:30-7:30pm

Botond Bogнар is an internationally known authority on Japanese architecture. Author of many books on Japanese aesthetics, architecture, and architects (including Kengo Kuma), Bogнар is currently Professor of Architecture at the University of Illinois. A book signing will follow.

MARCH 13 & 14: Bamboo Fence-Building Workshop

9am-3pm

This exciting two-day hands-on workshop experience gives you the skills you'll need to design and build a bamboo fence panel using traditional Japanese materials and techniques. Participants are asked to provide their own lunch.

MARCH 28: Sand & Stone Raking Workshop (NEW THIS YEAR!)

Train in the art of *karesansui* preparation, impression, and maintenance in this "behind the scenes" participation workshop.
