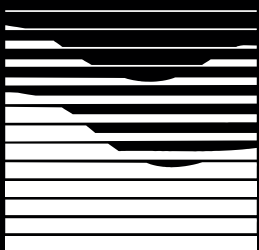

This competition is open to all landscape architects registered with the State of Washington. Projects may be located within or outside the State of Washington.

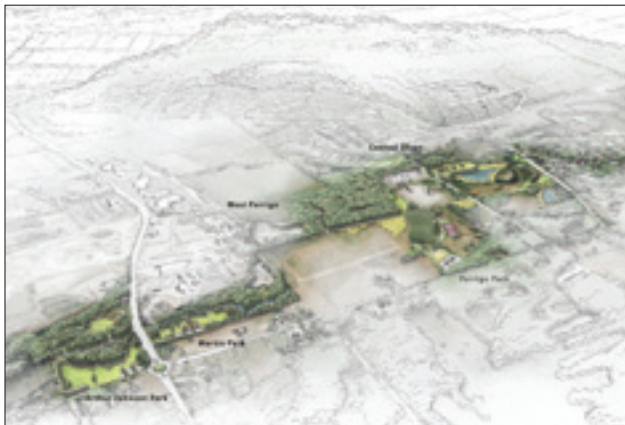
## AWARDS CELEBRATION

## THE SELECTION PROCESS

Work will be judged on: quality of design, analysis, planning and research; sustainability; context and environmental stewardship; presentation; and relevance to the profession, the public and the environment.

All submissions will be reviewed by the Professional Awards Jury. Submissions that do not meet the submission requirements will not be considered. The presentation boards and electronic submissions become the property of WASLA and may be used by WASLA for display, educational or marketing purposes.

# AWARDS CATEGORIES

## I. GENERAL DESIGN

**Recognizes:** Site specific, newly built works of landscape architecture or urban design. Projects that have utilized low impact development strategies are encouraged. Multi-phased projects may be submitted if early phases have been constructed and reflect the character of the entire project as a whole.

**Typical entries may include:** Public, institutional, or private landscapes of all kinds. Environmental restoration, preservation, sustainable design, use of salvaged or recycled materials, low impact methods for infrastructure such as the use of bioswales, green roofs, pervious pavement, etc. Special mention may be given to low-impact development.

## II. RESIDENTIAL DESIGN / DESIGN BUILD

**Recognizes:** Site specific works of landscape architecture that are smaller in scale or for residential use. Design build projects must be designed and built by the entrant.

**Typical entries may include:** Single or multi-family residential projects, landscapes for small business, activity areas for entertaining, small private spaces and gardens.

## III. RESEARCH, PLANNING AND ANALYSIS

**Recognizes:** Research or large scale planning projects that identify and investigate challenges posed in landscape architecture, providing results or guidelines by use of case studies, evaluation, test methods, etc. that advance the body of knowledge for the profession.

**Typical entries include:** Urban, suburban, rural or regional planning efforts or development guidelines, transportation planning, campus planning, environmental study or planning, resource reports, natural resource protection or conservation, assessments of social economic or environmental impacts of landscape architecture, study of landscape architecture in relation to public health, safety and welfare.

## IV. PUBLIC WORKS

**Recognizes:** Site specific works of landscape architecture completed by a public agency such as a city, state or federal department for excellence in the design and development of park and recreation facilities, public infrastructure, and transportation projects. Project must have been completed in the past two years.

**Typical entries include:** Park and open space master plans, park and recreation facilities and open space design and development, transportation corridors, resource planning and management and projects that impact legislative policy or regulatory controls.

## V. WORKS IN PROGRESS

**Recognizes:** Any unfinished or un-built work of landscape architecture that shares impactful ideas to the profession, but is not yet eligible for consideration under another award category.

## VI. PEOPLE'S CHOICE

**Recognizes:** The favorite entry voted by awards celebration attendees.

# SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

## YOUR SUBMISSION SHOULD INCLUDE:

1. One compact disc with:
  - A Microsoft PowerPoint presentation of no more than 20 slides. This is the heart of the entry and will be used by the Professional Awards Jury to judge the entry. Selected slides will be displayed during the Awards Celebration. Slides from winning entries may also be displayed on the WASLA website. Include descriptive text to presentation as desired, but do not identify the firm or landscape architect in the MS PowerPoint slides. Do not include video or audio in the MS PowerPoint presentation.
  - A Microsoft Word document describing the project in 500 words or less.
  - Three high resolution photographs or graphic images used in the preparation of the MS PowerPoint presentation. These images should be at least 2100 x 1500 pixels (300 DPI at a print size of 5" x 7"). If compressed as JPGs, files should be saved with maximum image quality. Acceptable formats: TIF, JPG, PSD. Include a Microsoft Word file that contains a caption and any photographer credit for all photographs submitted.
  - A photograph of the landscape architect(s).
  - Research, Planning and Analysis entries may include Adobe PDFs of printed work.
2. Two identical copies of a 24" x 36" foam core board appropriate for display on an easel in portrait format (vertical). (Sustainable alternatives to foam core may be used.) Drawings, photos, and other flat illustrative materials may be mounted on the board to describe the project. Do NOT mount models or other 3-dimensional structures on the board. Text should be part of the board layout and describe the project's purpose, features, significance and the role of the landscape architect. The foam core boards will be displayed during the awards celebration. The boards will subsequently be presented to Washington State University and the University

of Washington. They will be used to showcase excellence in landscape architecture, for teaching, and for promotion of the profession.

### KEVIN HOLDEN, RLA, ASLA

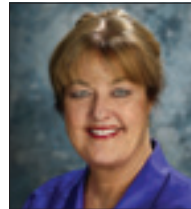

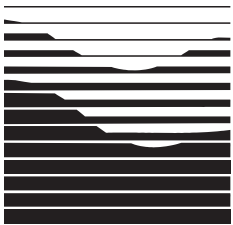


### LAUREN MELÉNDREZ, FASLA
